Physicals for Students

Kindergarten and 7th grade students must have a physical and immunizations before coming to school. According to Nebraska State Law schools are not to allow students to attend without their physical and immunizations.

Preschoolers must have all their immunizations that are required for Kindergarten.

Scheduled Meeting

The Pleasanton School District is required to consult with non-public school representatives and representatives of parents of children with disabilities parentally-placed in a nonpublic school during the design and development of special education and related services for the children. The purpose of the consultation process is to provide an opportunity for parents and representatives of non-public schools to participate in the development of a plan for providing special education services to children with disabilities who attend nonpublic schools and home schools which are within the Pleasanton School District for the 2016-2017 school year. Parents of a home-schooled child or a child attending a nonpublic school who has been or may be identified with a disability attending a nonpublic school within the boundaries of Pleasanton School District are urged to contact Ron Wymore, Superintendent to attend a consultation meeting scheduled in the Board Room at 10:00 a.m. June 28, 2016.

June 13, 2016

Meeting posted at the Pleasanton Post Office, River Stop, and Town & Country Bank.

The agenda was available at the office of the Superintendent.

The Board of Education for Pleasanton Public Schools, District 10-0105 met in regular session at 4:00 p.m. at the school. Members present were Zwiener, Hand, Nichols, Klein and Kingston. Pawloski was absent(excused). Vickie Lammers and Jeff Vetter were visitors.

President Zwiener called the meeting to order and opened with a statement reminding visitors that the board follows the Open Meetings Law of which a copy of the law is located in the room.

Motion by Kingston, seconded by Nichols to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion carried 5 – 0.

Moved by Nichols, seconded by Hand to approve the minutes of the last regular meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

Moved by Klein, seconded by Kingston to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried 5 – 0.

Moved by Hand, seconded by Klein to approve the last month's bills. Motion carried 4-0.

Move by Klein, seconded by Zwiener to accept bid from Karr Tuckpointing for exterior masonry preservation, maintenance and repair. Motion carried 5-0.

Motion by Hand, seconded by Nichols to adjourn at 6:04 p.m. Motion carried 5-0.
